

# ACA France Course Equivalencies at WWU

This guide identifies how courses taken at Campus Adventiste du Salève through Adventist Colleges Abroad (ACA) will apply toward requirements for general studies and for a minor in French at Walla Walla University.

Please note: One ACA course may apply toward both a general studies requirement and the electives requirement for a minor in French. Any ACA course not applicable toward either general studies or the electives requirement for a minor in French will count as general elective credit.

## Minor in French

Any FREN-prefix course at the intermediate level or higher (course numbers 200 and above) may apply as elective credit toward a minor in French at WWU.
