**Concentration: Management**  
**2025-2026**

**General Areas of Service:** The management concentration is an option for students wanting a general grounding in the management discipline. Students will find a broad range of opportunities available upon graduation, such as the following: supervision of operative workers, human resources management, compensation management, health service administration, hotel or motel management, government operational management, and self-employment. This concentration will help students meet managerial challenges and efficiently manage today's organizations. Private, profit-making corporations in every industry as well as all non-profit and government organizations need good managers.

**Professional Training:** There are no universal educational requirements for entry-level jobs in management. Experienced managers whose accomplishments reflect strong leadership qualities and the ability to improve the efficiency or competitive position of an organization will have the best opportunities. In an increasingly global economy, experience in international affairs, marketing, and knowledge of foreign languages may be beneficial. Most managers eventually seek a graduate degree (MBA).

**Job Outlook:** The U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics projects employment of administrative services and facilities managers is projected to grow 5 percent from 2022 to 2033, faster as the average for all occupations. The job outlook varies due to the myriad opportunities. Managers will be needed to help organizations navigate the increasingly complex and competitive business environment. Management of operations specialties is expected to grow. (See [www.bls.gov](http://www.bls.gov)) The independent and challenging nature of the work, combined with high earnings potential, makes this occupation attractive to many. Graduates are trained to successfully lead a team and complete goals efficiently.

**Earnings:** According to the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics, the median annual pay for administrative services managers was \$108,350 in May 2024. (See [www.bls.gov](http://www.bls.gov)) However, compensation for managers varies greatly, depending on experience, position level, and the industry. Many managers eventually seek a graduate degree (MBA), which can enhance compensation and advancement.
