

Theology and Religious Studies With the Pastoral Ministry Concentration Bachelor of Arts 2025-2026

General Areas of Service:

A degree in Theology and Religious Studies with the Pastoral Ministry Concentration provides students with a wide range of skills in both theology and leadership. Most students earning this degree enter pastoral as ministerial interns. Other graduates use it as the basis for pursuing more specialized careers in secondary education, advanced graduate work, chaplaincy, or even law.

Professional Training:

An undergraduate degree in Theology and Religious Studies qualifies students to be hired as ministerial interns and for entry into the Master of Divinity program in the SDA Theological Seminary, which is the standard educational background for Adventist clergy. Students who are hired as interns typically spend one to two years working in a local church after graduation, before being sponsored to the Seminary for two years. Students not receiving an internship are responsible for pursuing their own seminary education following graduation.

Job Outlook:

The prospect of future employment as a minister in the SDA denomination is very promising! With an aging pastoral workforce in North America, there is a growing need for new ministers. (See www.bls.gov)

Earnings:

The annual wage for SDA ministers depends on years of service and location. An entry-level salary can range from \$40,000 to an ordained senior pastor level at \$78,000 per year. (See www.bls.gov)

Note:

Exit Exams: Theology and Religious Studies majors must successfully complete a Senior Comprehensive Examination to graduate. Students taking the Pastoral Ministry concentration are also required to take a Greek and Hebrew exit exam prior to graduation. Students who pass at appropriate levels may not need to take the full Biblical language sequence if they attend the Seventh-day Adventist Theological Seminary at Andrews University.

Minor: Theology and Religious Studies majors are required to take a minor. Due to the highly structured nature of the degree, students pursuing the Pastoral Ministry concentration are encouraged to select the Biblical Languages minor. This minor gives students the greatest amount of flexibility in arranging their class schedule and thus graduating within four years.

Internship Program: Majors pursuing the Pastoral Ministry Concentration must complete an internship approved by the School of Theology. Those anticipating pastoral work in the Seventh-day Adventist Church must participate in the three-quarter internship program operated jointly between the School of Theology and the Upper Columbia Conference. A ten-week summer internship program with the North Pacific Union Conference is highly recommended. More details about this program can be found in the School of Theology Handbook.

Endorsement Process: Majors who want to receive a recommendation for denominational hiring need to gain Endorsement by a two-step process described in the School of Theology Handbook, which is described in the School of Theology Handbook.
