

Social Work Bachelor of Social Work 2025-2026

Nature of Work: Social work is a profession for those with a strong belief in social justice. Many social workers specialize in serving a particular population or working in a specific setting such as mental health, substance abuse, medical, public health, schools, geriatrics, developmental disabilities, corrections, child welfare, counseling, administration, research, policy development, and community organization. Some social workers help clients who face disabilities, life-threatening diseases, or social problems, such as inadequate housing, unemployment, or substance abuse. Social workers also assist families that have serious domestic conflicts, sometimes involving child or spousal abuse. Additionally, they may conduct research, advocate for improved services, or become involved in planning and policy development.

Professional Training: A bachelor's degree in social work (BSW) is the minimum requirement for entry into the occupation. Many social workers pursue a master's degree (MSW) to achieve greater career options and higher pay. Bachelor degree programs prepare graduates for direct service positions, such as a case manager, mental health worker, group home manager, and residential counselor. The BSW program includes courses in social work values and ethics, and humility. In addition, it advocates for social and economic justice. Courses cover human behavior and the social environment, social welfare policy and services, social work practice skills, social research methods, and field education. A minimum of 400 hours of supervised field experience is required.

Job Outlook: According to the Bureau of Labor Statistics, Overall employment of social workers is projected to grow 9 percent from 2021 to 2031, faster than the average for all occupations. About 74,700 openings for social workers are projected each year, on average, over the decade... (See www.bls.gov)

Earnings: The Bureau of Labor Statistics reports the median annual wage for social workers in 2023 in the Seattle area is over \$90,000, and the average pay for a social worker in California is over \$72,000. Child, family, and school social workers average earnings were \$49,150. For health care social workers, the median annual wages were reported as \$60,840 and mental health and substance abuse social workers' average as \$49,130. (See www.bls.gov)
